Subject: Request for Proposal 2021-18 Loader

Recommendation

That City Council approves the award of a contract to Brandt Tractor Ltd. in the amount of \$344,680.72 (plus HST) for the provision of a loader with an additional bucket, boom iib arm, and extended warranty.

Background

A heavy-duty loader is essential to Roads operations as it is used throughout the City operating a variety of equipment to complete snow clearing tasks and other specialized activities such as asphalt grinding. Since the dependability of this machine is vital for the department's critical operations, it has been identified for replacement due to the high maintenance costs on this unit and frequent downtime.

Financial/Legal Implications

A formal bid request, which closed February 19, 2021, was administered by the Purchasing Department and was publically advertised in accordance with the City's Purchasing By-Law 2013-200. Five proposals were evaluated by the Purchasing Manager, Fleet Manager, Manager of Roads Traffic & Landfill Operations, Supervisor Fleet, Fleet Coordinator and Operations Staff. The evaluation considered mandatory technical requirements related to the product's performance and features, company

experience, qualifications, build, durability, extra options, warranty, service, support, operator evaluations and price.

The results are as follows:

5	J.R. Brisson Equipement Ltee.	79.39

The proposal from Brandt Tractor Ltd scored the highest and provides the best overall value to the City. Their bid is considered fair and reasonable.

Sufficient funding for this purchase is available in the Fleet Life Cycle Reserve No. 99586R and will be transferred in accordance with Council Resolution 2018-92 as explained in Report to Council 2018-22. Capital Project No. 8021FL – Vehicle and Equipment Life Cycle 2021 will be used to track this fleet purchase in accordance with the fleet governance model.

Options Analysis

- 1. That City Council approves the award of a contract to Brandt Tractor Ltd. in the amount of \$344,680.72 (plus HST) for the provision of a loader with an additional bucket, boom jib arm, and extended warranty.
- Do not award a contract. This option is not recommended because the Roads department requires a dependable loader and downtime is a critical issue. If the City continues to operate the existing loader increased downtime is expected and repairs will be cost-prohibitive.

Recommended Option

That City Council approves the award of a contract to Brandt Tractor Ltd. in the amount of \$344,680.72 (plus HST) for the provision of a loader with an additional bucket, boom jib arm, and extended warranty.
