Recommendation

That City Council approves the award of a contract to Election Systems & Software Canada ULC in the amount of \$99,655.00 (plus HST) for the provision of an integrated internet and paper ballot/tabulator count voting solution for the 2022 Municipal and School Board Election.

Background

The Municipal and School Board Elections will be held on Monday, October 24th, 2022. Pursuant to the *Municipal Elections* Act, S.O. 1996 a municipality has until May 1st in the year of an election to pass a by-law authorizing the use:

- 1. of voting and vote-counting equipment;
- 2. an alternative voting method that does not require electors to attend a voting place in order to vote.

On Tuesday, July 13^{th} , 2021, Council passed By-Law 2021-69 to allow for alternative voting methods.

On Tuesday, June 29^{th} , 2021, Council passed Resolution 2021-263 authorizing the City Clerk to prepare an RFP for in-person voting with tabulators and

electronic voting (hybrid method) for the 2022 Municipal and School Board Elections.

This hybrid method will provide constituents with a broader choice on their preference to cast their votes and will reduce the risks associated with relying on a single voting method.

As COVID-19 has impacted every aspect of our current lives and will continue for the foreseeable future, this is a factor that must be considered when planning for the 2022 Municipal and School Board Election.

Financial/Legal Implications

A formal bid request, which closed August 11, 2021, was administered by the Purchasing Department and was publically advertised in accordance with the City's Purchasing By-Law 2013-200. Three proposals were evaluated by the Purchasing Manager, the City Clerk, the Deputy City Clerk, the Database Specialist and the Information Systems Manager. The evaluation considered mandatory technical requirements, company experience and qualifications, project management, system solutions, support, and price.

The results are as follows:

The proposal from Election Systems & Software Canada ULC scored highest and provides the best overall value to the City. Their bid is considered fair and reasonable.

Costs associated with Municipal and School Board Elections are funded from the Election Reserve (99526R). The Election Reserve is funded annually through an allocation from the Operating Budget. The current annual contribution to the reserve is \$65,000. As at the date of the report, the Election Reserve has a balance of \$284,539.00. The total expected costs of the election will be reviewed as part of the 2022 Operating Budget process and the annual allocation from the Operating Budget will be adjusted accordingly.
