Recommendation

That City Council authorize the execution of the attached agreement with the Automotive Materials Stewardship to permit the City to continue to receive payment for antifreeze, oil filters and used oil containers collected at the City's Household Hazardous Waste Depot.

Background

The City has been in an agreement with the Automotive Materials Stewardship (AMS) for several years. This agreement outlines the Automotive Materials Stewardship's financial responsibilities for the management of various hazardous waste materials collected at the City of North Bay's Household Hazardous Waste facility.

The Ministry of Environment Conservation and Parks issued new legislation called the Hazardous and Special Products Regulation which came into effect October 1, 2021. The attached is AMS's updated agreement in response to the new legislation. The agreement will commence immediately and its initial term will continue until December 31, 2022. This Agreement will automatically renew for successive one (1) year terms unless or until it is terminated in accordance with this Agreement.

Financial/Legal Implications

There is no financial implication should the City execute this agreement. Should the City not execute the agreement, the City would not be compensated for materials received after October 1, 2021.
