Recommendation

That City Council approves the award of a contract to 1450384 Ontario Inc. o/a A&S Towing, based on the unit rates specified in their bid for RFQ 2022-07 for the provision of towing services, for a term of three years.

Background

The Fleet Department relies on contractors to supply labour, material and specialized equipment necessary to tow City equipment and vehicles and provide recovery services on an as needed or emergency basis. The current contract for towing services is expiring.

Financial/Legal Implications

A formal bid request, which closed February 2, 2022, was administered by the Purchasing Department and was publically advertised in accordance with the City's Purchasing By-Law 2013-200. Two quotes were evaluated by the Purchasing Manager and the Parts Technician. The evaluation considered company ability & experience, availability of equipment, qualified staff and price. The results are as follows:

Ranking	Company	Bid Price
1	1450384 Ontario Inc. o/a A&S Towing	\$125,580.00
2	Lewis Motor Sales (North Bay) Inc.	\$147,905.00

The bid price of \$125,580.00 (plus HST) from 1450384 Ontario Inc. o/a A&S Towing represents a total cost over the three year term based on the estimated quantities specified in the RFQ. Under the terms of the contract, the City will pay the rates specified in their bid and is not bound to any specific quantities. The actual quantity and the value of work requested will vary based on operational requirements. The quote from 1450384 Ontario Inc. o/a A&S Towing was the lowest bid and provides the best overall value to the City. Their bid is considered fair and reasonable.

Funding for towing services provided under this contract is managed within the operating budget of the Fleet Department. Sufficient funding will continue to be requested in future years.
